



- Withdrawal of HLF funding
- New application pack and guidance notes (from April 2009)
- Application process designed to make it even easier to apply. It is now in 2 stages and only takes 8 weeks. Includes reading guidance, sending in application. Within 30 working days a conditional offer may be made. Organisation then provides necessary documents within 20 working days with the grant being confirmed within 10 working days.

Wales Gets Switched On to Switchover Help Scheme

The Switchover Help Scheme has been set up to help eligible older and disabled people to make the change to digital TV this summer. People are eligible if they are:

- Aged 75 or over
- If they have lived in a care home for six months or more,
- If they get (or could get) attendance or constant attendance allowance, mobility supplement or disability living allowance,
- Or if they are registered blind or partially sighted.

For a one-off payment of £40, eligible people will be offered:

- Easy-to-use equipment to convert one television set
- Installation of that equipment
- An aerial check and upgrade if necessary
- A demonstration of how it works
- Someone to call for help while they are getting used to it.

Working with Word Views—To Select a document view

Click the View menu to select Print Layout, Normal, Web Layout, Outline, Reading Layout, Document Map, or Thumbnails or

Use the View buttons (bottom left of your screen

You can use the **Document Map** or **Thumbnails** to jump quickly to different sections of your document. You will find both of these viewing modes in your View menu.

Use the scroll button on your mouse to zoom in and out of documents quickly. Just hold down the Ctrl key and roll the scroll wheel forward to get a closer view of the document, or roll it back to shrink it. You will find this feature very useful and it works in most of the packages.

We are on the Way

'We are on the Way' is an information booklet prepared by the Welsh Assembly Government setting out its policy agenda to transform the lives of disabled children and young people. The Seven Core Aims apply equally to disabled children and young people, although they often have additional barriers to overcome in achieving and accessing the same opportunities. The booklet highlights what the Assembly Government has put in place, mapped under each Core Aim, and what it intends to do next to improve the life chances of disabled children and young people.

Safeguarding

From July 2010 (PLEASE NOTE REVISED DATE) it will be a legal requirement for individuals applying to work or volunteer with children or vulnerable adults to be registered with the Independent Safeguarding Authority (ISA). This is not instead of having a CRB (Criminal Records Bureau) check as the two will work alongside each other. New applicants will be registered from July 2010 as will those who are moving into new roles within the field. It is anticipated that existing volunteers and paid staff will be brought into the scheme at a later date. It will be the responsibility of the individual to register with the Vetting and Barring Scheme which will cost £64 per individual but free of charge for volunteers.

Creating links with Cartrefi Cymru

As you may be aware, Conwy County Borough Council's housing stock was transferred to a new housing organisation called Cartrefi Cymru in September 2008, which now undertakes all of the management and maintenance of some 3800 homes.

Cartrefi Cymru has developed a programme of improvements which will allow all of the homes to be brought up to a modern standard set by the Welsh Assembly Government, by 2012. As part of this process they will be looking to encourage social inclusion & create opportunities for local individuals who are outside the normal employment streams to benefit from work that will be created through the implementation of the improvement programme.

Initially they will create a database of organisations that work with vulnerable individuals who would like to get back to work. As the programme develops in the future, they will use this information to target employment and training opportunities.

North Wales Coast Strategic Regeneration Area

The Wales Assembly Government has recently designated the area from Prestatyn in the east to Mochdre in the west including Rhyl, Kinmel Bay, Towyn, St Asaph, Abergele and Colwyn Bay as a Strategic Regeneration Area.

The issues that identify the area as requiring regeneration funding are: -

- Deprivation Economic Inactivity/Unemployment
- Poor Housing Quality
- Transient Population Significant in/out migration
- Physical Environment Neglect, under investment and inappropriate development
- Benefits Culture High benefits dependency
- Community Engagement Community First areas
- Perception Negative Image

This SRA designation will attract significant regeneration <u>capital</u> funding of up to £70m over the next seven to ten years into the area. The programme will be undertaken based on six themes - Space for Living (Housing), Health and Well-being, Education and Skills, Community Cohesion, Environment and Transport and Sustainable Economy. Under WAG guidance a multi-agency group has been established for each theme through which projects will be both developed and channelled.

Projects for the Colwyn Bay area will be submitted via the Bay Life Programme Management Board.

The core funding for the SRA will be from the Wales Assembly Government with additional funding streams being accessed such as Sustainable Transport, Environmental Risk (improved sea defences), Strategic Infrastructure, Interreg 11A, Environment for Growth, ESF, Physical Regeneration and JESSICA (town centre redevelopment scheme).

Although the funding is for capital projects only, there should be opportunities for voluntary organisations, within the designated area, to submit bids. The refurbishment of an existing property would be an example, which may meet the funding criteria.

NHS Reform

The Welsh Assembly Government's consultation process on the main proposals for the reform of the National Health Service in Wales has been completed. The next phase is to now concentrate on local and regional issues with the establishment of a North Wales Transition Reference Group. This group, which is a multi-agency partnership, will provide a forum to ensure appropriate relevant involvement and engagement of stakeholders in the healthcare reform of NHS services across North Wales.
