# Second chance to become eligible for ILM contracts in East Wales

**WCVA's Intermediate Labour Market (ILM) scheme has re-opened its pre-qualification questionnaire (PQQ) schedule – providing a second opportunity for organisations to become eligible to tender for contracts in the Regional Competitiveness and Employment areas of East Wales.**

The scheme, backed by a total of £18m European and Assembly funding, is investing in organisations to provide on-the-job training and support to economically inactive people via a period of supported employment.

In order to be considered for the approved supplier list, organisations will need to complete and submit a pre-qualification questionnaire (PQQ) by **1pm on Monday 10 May 2010**.

## Call to reward Wales' outstanding volunteers

**WCVA has launched the Wales Volunteer of the Year Awards which this year are supported by CCLA Investment Management Ltd.**

Since the awards scheme started in 2004, it has grown over the years and now receives over 200 nominations in five categories, which have been chosen to reflect the range of volunteering opportunities across Wales.

As well as recognition of individuals, young people (under 25 years), and groups, the scheme also rewards 'green' volunteers and trustees. There will be up to three winners in each category, with 15 national winners presented with their awards at a ceremony in Cardiff in June, and all nominees awarded commendation certificates at a local ceremony or by post.

The 2009 winners included a 14-year-old 'eco warrior', a former teacher who works on a voluntary basis more than most people work when they are paid to for the RSPCA and a group of volunteers who support people with visual impairment – despite all being either totally blind or partially sighted themselves.

## Funding available to create jobs for young people

**Funding is still available for third sector organisations to create jobs for 18-24 years olds through the Department for Work and Pensions' Future Jobs Fund.**

WCVA made a successful bid to DWP last year for funding for the sector in Wales – and money is still available for organisations to support young people affected by the economic downturn.

The Future Jobs Fund aims to support unemployed young people, and those in unemployment hotspots, by funding the creation of 170,000 new jobs across the UK until April 2011.

Since the launch of the Future Jobs Fund, 4,600 new jobs for young people have been announced across Wales, in a range of areas including environmental work, health and social care, and youth and community work.
