RECENTLY COMPLETED PROJECT

CENTRE OF SIGN SIGHT SOUND

Centre of Sign Sight Sound received £8,922.30 to provide a number of workshops and educational courses for individuals. The types of workshops they held were information about health and wellbeing, first aid, waste, renewable energy and much more. Unfortunately with the Covid 19 pandemic they weren't able to continue to run the workshops so they created an information document and videos for supporting individuals with their lives. The videos included information about how to shop safely during the pandemic, information about scams, the restrictions rules of pandemic, how to shop safely during the pandemic and much more. These videos were watched 59,000 times with many finding them very useful.



DEAFBLIND UK

With the £5,647 the Deafblind UK project received they produced and distributed information packs to blind and deaf individuals across the coast of Conwy and Denbighshire. The information packs included useful information from sensory charities, carers charities, NHS, Social Services well-being team, Disability Resource Centre and the county's volunteer services as well as helpline links. Around 400 individuals were assisted with the information packs and it was possible to create a digital pack that enabled them to reach more individuals. The information packs have certainly benefited their lives making life easier as all the information is in one place. A recipient said "I've been looking for some of this information on the computer... but I'm not too good with that, so it's great to have it all in hand like this".





TENOVUS CANCER CARE

To support a project to help people affected by cancer in response to the pandemic, Tenovus Cancer Care received £8,000.

They provided information about four cancer specialist services, Freephone Cancer Support Line, Callback Service, Virtual Sing with Us Choir and Tele-Friend. All services, except the virtual choir, provide volunteering opportunities that can enable individuals to develop new or improve existing skills. This project will provide access to diverse specialist support services in the tough times of the Covid 19 pandemic.
