During the programme 5 people "gained their confidence massively" from hardly talking to giving invaluable feedback as well as stepping outside of their comfort zone transferring skills learnt into their day to day lives

AGE CONNECT NORTH WALES CENTRAL

Age Connect received £3,334.06 for the production and distribution of monthly newsletters mainly for older people and particularly for people without digital facilities. Newsletters contained useful information, support contact details, light hearted fun, content from the older people themselves and local partner organizations. The newsletters reach over 1,600 individuals and over 500 organizations engaging and disseminating useful information to a wide audience ensuring members feel connected and less isolated.
